Our open afternoon in May, mentioned in my last newsletter, was a happy and informative event. Simon Roberts of Union Farm (close neighbour to the church) showed how local history is slowly revealing itself through the archaeological research being done on his farm. Some 35 people enjoyed afternoon tea and a tour of the church.

Blythburgh's Jubilee celebrations in June were a wonderful success and the church played its full part. The village was awakened with a peal of bells, floral crowns appeared in the



Church porch and villager Adam Burrows hoisted the flag on the tower, which was resplendent in red, white and blue.
