As you know, it has been an unprecedented year of work on our wonderful church. First, the maintenance on the bell frame was successfully completed in the early summer. Then the south-side window was restored with clear glass in memory of Peter and Diana Coghill. And finally for this year, we are looking forward to the completion of the tower project in time for Christmas.

There has been a temporary hitch. Thanks to the new limit on the amount of VAT that can be reclaimed on the work, we have an unexpected shortfall of around £21,000. However, plans are underway to address this. Katie Sullivan and Paul Simmons, two of our members, took part in the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust sponsored 'Ride and Stride' to raise funds. And we have a special 'Sponsor an Item' scheme in place, whereby people can cover the cost of things as diverse and useful as a WC fitting, kitchen doorknobs or a galley door! And the good news is that we, as the Friends, are able to contribute £10,000 to an improvement that will make us more able to welcome congregations and all the extra events that take place in the church.
