Work in the tower

You may find the church in a slightly untidy state this year, as we are having work done under the west tower - the lowered floor will accommodate two toilets and a servery, while there will be an upper floor to accommodate the bellringers who currently practise every Tuesday evening at 8 p.m. We are lucky that our PCC member and Honorary Friend, Charles Morris, has designed all this for us. Faculty has been granted for the work to begin as soon as possible.

Postponed Open Afternoon

We were disappointed to have to cancel our Open Afternoon last year due to the illness of our speaker, Rev. Malcolm Doney. With his regained

good health, Malcolm has re-arranged the event for this year, Saturday 17 May at 2.30p.m, until 4p.m. The subject remains Ronald Blythe (1922-2023), the well-known Suffolk writer and churchman, whose most famous book is still Akenfield (1969), the fictional (but rooted in reality) interviews with Suffolk villagers on the cusp of the end of life and farming as it had been known in Suffolk for centuries. A friend of many cultural names of the 20th century, such as Benjamin Britten, Peter Pears, and John and Christine Nash (he lived with the Nashes for many years at their house, Bottengoms in Wormingford, Essex), Blythe was also a committed Anglican and churchwarden of St Andrew, Wormingford and lay canon of St Edmundsbury Cathedral. 
