Open Afternoon 2023. Everyone present agreed that our spring Open Afternoon was a great success. Our speaker, Alan Mackley, took us on an entertaining virtual motor tour based on the charmingly illustrated diary of a 450-mile joyride kept by the 19-year-old Janet Becker. Janet, who is memorialised in the church, was the daughter of acclaimed local artist Harry Becker and an expert in church conservation.

Celebrating a milestone. Almost every Thursday morning at 11am, Blythburgh resident Colin Huggins can be found lurking in the church porch. He's waiting for visitors to arrive for a free church tour. He seldom knows how many people will arrive, but almost every week, someone does – often quite a number. Colin started these tours in 2018 and he has just welcomed his 1,000th visitor! Help from the Men's Shed, Halesworth.

As members of the Friends know, Holy Trinity has embarked on a project to install clear glass in all its windows, and we have supported this undertaking by contributing towards the stonework needed for the installation of the glass. Six windows have so far been renovated, thanks to a number of kind donors. The Parochial Church Council wanted to

acknowledge these valuable gifts. However, it's difficult to add permanent features in a Grade 1 listed building, so, they decided to commission a moveable plaque for each window. And the Halesworth Men's Shed have ridden to the rescue. Their skilled participants have lovingly created a series of oak blocks to hold brass plaques, which are then placed on the church windowsills to commemorate the windows' donors.

Animal magic. August saw another hugely enjoyable **Blessing of the Animals** service. Over 100 people and their animals gathered. Seventy-eight dogs were joined by six horses, a solo cat, a single chicken, a collection of moths and Jamie the 90-year-old tortoise.



Harvest Festival on Sunday 17 September was followed by a hearty Harvest lunch, featuring a special loaf baked by Graham King.
